

In 1929, a blind African American preacher from the street of Texas name Willie Johnson, wrote, sing and produced a song he called "Let your light shine on Me." When he was seven years old, his stepmother, fighting with his father, threw lye in his face, permanently blinding him. From his youth he sang gospel songs while playing guitar. Johnson recorded 30 songs in 1927–1930. His strong voice was a rough, low baritone; joined with his urgently rhythmic guitar, along with his singing achieved great force in his message, in spite of the darkness in which he lived. His life's message was dedicated to letting the light of Christ shine. This present age is filled with threats of terrorist attacks, twisted morality, a refusal to accept and recognize God's values, and yet as Christians we are called to Let our light shine and walk in His Light.

Christ has placed His Church in the world at this time to "shine as lights," we are to shine in this age like stars in the midst of a dark sky. We are heaven's royal ambassadors, our charge as Christian is to share the Word of God with all those who are in darkness. Jesus described this light as our "good works" - "Let men see your good works that they may glorify your Father who is in Heaven" (Matt 5:16). The Bible says, "but if we walk in the Light as He Himself is the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleans us from all sin" (1 John 1:7).

ISIS (the Islamic State of Iraq and Sham) -- "Sham" is an old Arabic term which means Syria and Lebanon) the name doesn't need any more explanation. We know what it is -- evil personified. ISIS has brutally killed thousand's mostly non-Sunnis, in a quest for power; Christians and small groups called Yazidis have been targeted. In the words of President Obama, "this is a new evil encroaching our perceived freedoms and international interest." We have seen in the United States, airplanes flown into buildings, our citizens beheaded, mass shooting, bombing and just recently another mass shooting at a Christmas party. It is easy to see our world is grown anxious about terrorist and fear is becoming the new normal. This dark world is surely ripe for the light of Jesus; we must not fail our call to serve this present age. The need is great to let our light shine.

Every dedicated saint makes the difference in this dark world. As Christians of the Mt. Zion Primitive Baptist fellowship, we must continually align ourselves to answer the call to let our light shine – answer our calling. Our light shines best when we witness and share Christ. We must let our light shine and not allow it to be concealed or dimmed in any way, either by offense, neglect, laziness, shame or by terror. We must walk in a way that is consistent with the written Word, for Scripture is light to our path. We must refuse to be quite, to be overwhelmed, to be at a lost of what to do, but rather we must be engrossed and assessed with shining our light.


As we walk in the light, we notice the 1John 1:7, here we learn first that God is Light and in Him there is no darkness at all. When we live and allow ourselves to be absorbed completely in Him, we are cleansed from all sin and have fellowship with God. Our fellowship with Him is because we are living inside the presence of the person of the Holy Spirit. The command to walk in the Light implies His light is right and realistic, this walk bring real relationship. "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the defense of my life; whom shall I dread ----My Adversaries and my enemies, they stumble and fell.

This Christmas we are reminded that while in Bethlehem Mary gave birth to God's Son. Scripture reminds us that Jesus' birthplace fulfills God's promise. "But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting" (Micah 5:2) God Son left heaven and came to a world filled with darkness to bring light to every man woman and child. 



With the year coming to a close Tax time is right around the corner. The filing deadline for Tax year 2015 is April 15, 2016. Alabama State deadline is also April 15, 2016.

Beware of the newest phone scam where the callers claim to be with the IRS. They can sound convincing when they call. They use fake names and fake IRS identification numbers.

They may alter the caller ID to make it look like the IRS is calling.

Victims are told they owe money to the IRS and it must be paid promptly. NOTE that the IRS will never: 1). call to demand immediate payment or money owed without first sending a bill or a letter. 2). Require you to use a specific payment method for your taxes . 3.) Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone. 4) threaten to have the police or other law enforcement arrest you for not paying.

Also the IRS does not initiate email contact with taxpayers to request personal or financial information.



Having A Healthy Heart

A joyful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones. Proverbs 17:22

A question to our men. How often do you go to the doctor? Do you keep regular visits or do you wait until you are very sick? The biggest obstacle to improving the health of men is themselves. Statistics show that women are 33% more likely than men to visit the doctor. Men don't always make their health a priority. They wait as long as possible to see if they get better or symptoms go away before seeking medical care or advice. The biggest problem that men have is not so much a specific

disease, but the diseases are a result of lack of healthcare monitoring earlier in life. For example, if you don't get your cholesterol checked when it's going higher when you're in your 20's, or don't get your blood pressure checked when you're in your 30's, maybe your blood sugar starts increasing when you're in your 40's. What do you think may happen when you hit 50's? If you said heart disease, you are correct.

Heart disease is one of the leading causes of death in black men. This article isn't to tell you about the signs and symptoms of heart failure, for I am sure most of us has heard them many times, but to inform you of some important factors to help you keep a healthy heart. "Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, as it goes well with your soul. 3 John 1:2. It's the Lord's Prayer that you be in good health not only a healthy soul, but a healthy body. I want to share some tips to help you maintain a healthy heart, body and soul.

- 1. Reduce fat intake. A certain amount is good for a well-balanced diet. Limit saturated fats because they affect your cholesterol level.
- 2. Eat less salt. We all know large amounts of salt has been linked to high blood pressure. Try a salt substitute like accent or Mrs. Dash.
- 3. Exercise. Regular exercise improved heart function and lowers blood pressure and blood cholesterol. It doesn't have to be extensive, walking or swimming are two great was to exercise.
- 4. Keep weight down. Being overweight puts extra stress and strain on your heart. Try eating more fruits and vegetables and less sugary foods.
- 5. Stop smoking. This cuts your chances of getting heart and respiratory disease. If you have had a heart attack quitting will reduce the risk of a second one.
- 6. Relax. Find time for relaxation. Try meditation and prayer, quite time to read the bible, put your problems aside for awhile. This helps to reduce stress.
- 7. Think lifestyle changes rather than dietary changes. By living and eating in a healthier way you will feel better, more energized, more confident and happier.
- 8. Monitor your health status. Keep check on your weight for any abnormal weight gain suddenly. Monitor and record your blood pressure. This is necessary if you have high blood pressure or has had a previous heart attack.
- 9. Drink five or more 8oz glasses of water a day. This could help lower your risk of heart disease by 60%.
- 10. Keep those regular doctor visits. No one likes going to the doctor, but it is something that is needed to monitor your health.

These tips are not a fool proof way to prevent heart disease, but it decreases your chances tremendously. For more tips on having a healthy heart please visit menshealth.com "100 ways to protect your heart".

The Eternal Son

"Upon us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given: (Isaiah 9:6). This verse, becoming so popular at Christmas time, presents two (2) truths: the Son of God is fully human and eternally Son. The first part of the scripture says He became man - "a child is born." When Luke wrote in his gospel that, "unto you is born this day A Saviour, which is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11), he conveyed the same message. Both the Hebrew and Greek words for "born" refer to child-bearing. In Lukes' latter part of the scripture verse saying "Son is given". This reference is to the eternal sonship. In the Hebrew, the word "given" does not refer to birth or beginning, but to "bringing forth with purpose" the Son who already existed. John recorded His being brought forth in these word: "God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved" (John 3:17). Our Lord did not become the Son of God – that He always was, is and will be (Hebrews 13:8). The whole truth is not just that "a Child is born", but also that "a Son is given." Those who focus on the first part may only enjoy His coming for the Christmas season. Those who also grab hold of the second part can enjoy His coming for all seasons - even to the end of the Age.
