Most people lone for strong bodies, minds and spiritual strength, which they believe, points to healthy lives. However strong the body, and the mind, there is still a need and desire for an assurance of tomorrow, or an eternal hope. Hope is best described as an assurance of what we have not seen, something akin to faith. A better understanding of the significance of Easter will help build our **H.O.P.E.**

On Easter Sunday or Resurrection Day, we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, who is Jesus the Christ. It was over 2000 years ago, that Jesus rose from the dead. Early, before dawn some 2000 years ago some women with good intentions rose early to go to Jesus' tomb, only to find it empty. After hearing the report of the women, several of Jesus disciples ran to the tomb and found it empty, each of them there learned that Jesus Christ had risen from the grave.

Today Jesus tomb is empty, unlike the tomb of Buddha, his body was cremated and his ashes lay in monuments. Today most of the great or powerful world leaders of yesterday, all have tombs you can visit where their remains are entombed; But not Jesus. Our Lord Jesus' tomb is empty. There is no body there. There are no ashes there. There are no remains there, why, because Jesus rose alive from the dead!

The Devil did his best to keep Jesus down. The grave did all it could to hold its captive. But, after 3 days, the Father said, "Enough." An angel was dispatched to the earth. As his foot touched the ground, an earthquake hit and the stone rolled away from the tomb. Not to let Jesus out, but to let the women and disciples in, so they could see Jesus was gone.

Now, what is the result of this resurrection? What difference does it make to us? How does the resurrection of Jesus give you and me hope today? Because of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, 1 Peter 3:1 says, "He has given us a new birth into a living hope." What is this living hope? What is the hope we now have, that only the resurrection of Jesus Christ can give us?

- 1. We now have a hope, and the knowledge, that death is not the end. For much of recorded history, mankind has often been unsure of whether there is really life after death. Even today, many claim that this life is all there is. But, because Jesus rose, we now have a hope in the certainty that one-day we too will rise again, that we too will live again. The Bible calls Jesus "the Firstborn from the dead. Because of Jesus' resurrection we have a certain hope that even if we die, one day we will live again.
- 2. Our hope includes the knowledge that evil does not win. Sometimes today, it seems that the bad guy often wins. Sometimes it seems that the one who cheats, the one who lies, the one who steps on others at work to get ahead, is the one who prospers. It seems that there is

no hope for the little guy, the one who lives right, to ever get ahead. I imagine the disciples and the followers of Jesus felt that way, for 3 days. For 3 days, they wondered how the Roman Empire could get away with what it had done to Jesus. Pontius Pilate had brutally ordered Jesus death. The disciples thought how could this terrible thing happen, but then on the 3rd day, "Up from the grave Jesus rose, with a mighty triumph over His foes. He arose the victor from the dark domain and He lives forever on His throne to reign. He arose. He arose. Hallelujah Christ arose. So our hope is in Jesus, because he arose, we too can arise and triumph over death, and trials.

3. Our hope includes the knowledge that God forgives – Mark 16:7. Why in the world would the angel in Mark 16:7 specifically mention Peter? Why would he call him by name? Peter had walked with Jesus for 3 years. He knew Jesus intimately. He had watched as Jesus performed miracles....On the night of the Lord's Supper, Peter told Jesus, "Even if the rest of them leave you, I never will."...Later, Peter denied Jesus 3 times.

Imagine this scene if you will. The women come from the tomb, to the upper room. They pound on the door of the upper room where the disciples were hiding until finally the disciples open the door. The women burst into the room and breathlessly tell all those assembled there what the angel had said. As they tell their story, they glance around. Over in the corner they see Peter. He's no longer acting so bold. He's no longer acting like a leader. He's sitting alone in the corner, head hung low. Seeing him there the women say, "Oh and Peter. The angel specifically mentioned you. He mentioned you by name. He said, "Tell the disciples and Peter." Go tell the disciples and Peter. Jesus wanted him to know that he was still a child of His. He wanted Peter to know that all is forgiven. Oh my friend, God forgives. I don't know what you have done.... God forgives. Here is real hope "Jesus rose, and He forgives." This Hope is opportunity for peace and eternal life.

1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

4. Our hope includes the knowledge that new life is an option. Many who have been trapped in sin, who have battled the same sin time and time again, and have been beaten over and over and over again, sometimes reach the point where they believe they can never escape. They believe they are trapped in that sin, in that addiction, forever. Reader, will you accept the Hope of Easter? Romans 6:4 Therefore we were buried with Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too may walk in a new way of life.

Friend, Jesus' resurrection proves that you can have a new life filled with Hope. You can have the life Peter spoke of "lively," filled with Hope, opportunity, peace and eternal blessings.

In confronting, a problem in the church of Corinth Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 6:9-11, to the Christians in Corinth, "You used to be like that, but you've been saved. You're washed, you're sanctified, you're justified. You're not like that anymore. 2 Corinthians 5:17 If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature. Old things have passed away. Behold, all things are become new.

5. Our Hope Finally includes the promise of a better tomorrow. At death, we will gain a better inheritance. One imperishable, uncorrupted, and unfading, kept in heaven for us. It is kept in heaven for those who know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Jesus said, "I am going away to prepare a place for you." What a place that promises to be! The Bible says there are no more tears there. There is no more pain in the promise tomorrow. Friend, Will you accept this new life now?

My friend, this Easter or Resurrection Sunday many of us rose early for worship before sunrise, We overlooked the yawning and stretching, because we reminiscing the great hope that we have because of our Risen Savior. This Easter as we do each Sunday, we gather to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Because He rose, we know Death is not the end. Because He rose, we know evil does not win. Because He rose, we know God forgives. Because He rose we know a new life is our option though Christ. Because He rose, we know a better tomorrow is coming. Because He rose, we can live a life of Peace & have the assurance of eternal life.

The **H.O.P.E.** of Jesus is the only true place to find healthy living. Today on Easter Sunday we find living Hope in Jesus, because He has given us new life. A Life full of **H**ope or assurance, we cannot always see it, yet by faith we believe it. A life of Hope is a life of **O**pportunity where Christ opens doors and sets us on fresh new paths. A life of hope is a life of **P**eace where Christ gives us peace in the midst of my personal storms. Finally a life of Hope is **E**ternal only though Jesus Christ. Saints in order to have real hope it must surpass this life and offer assurance over death. Hope in Jesus gives me eternal hope that will transcend pass the grave. Therefore, when we understand Easter truly we see in Easter, Jesus offers us real **H.O.P.E.**

Just a few words about Mt. Zion's Young Adult Ministry and why this Ministry is much needed.

up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it.


With the help and guides of the Holy Spirit we are looking forward to great things to come to grow this ministry. So, with that been said, Most of all we need your support and prayers.

C. Gene Wilkes, Ph.D., has served as Pastor of Legacy Baptist Church in Plano, Texas, since 1987. He has also written: *Paul on Leadership, My Identity in Christ*, and *With All My Soul*. Gene is a national conference speaker on the topic of spiritual gifts, lay mobilization, making disciples, and servant leadership. He has also taught in Albania, Canada, China, Cuba, and Russia.

Author's Acknowledgement: "THIS book is my confession that God is truly a gracious God. Only divine goodness, not my abilities or desires, has ultimately put this book in your hands."

Wilkes puts forth both scripture, experience and his heart and love for God in this work. Providing the basic guidelines that any church member and/or leader can use in the formation of a Godly leadership process. As you progress through the chapters you are reminded that Our savor and Lord was indeed a servant leader both by word and deed. Such topics that are covered: Jesus' model of servant leadership. Jesus provides us at least three times in the scripture His Mission Statement "The Mission —And The Vision" We are reminded that Jesus was never

self-serving, He led first as a servant to his Father in heaven, who gave Him his mission; "For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of Him who sent me". John 6:38.

- ➤ "When Jesus stood in his hometown synagogue, he read his mission statement from Isaiah: 'The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor' Isaiah 61:1, Luke4:18-19."
- ➤ When Jesus stood among his disciples and defined greatness and being a leader in the kingdom of God, he couched his mission statement this way: 'For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.' Mark 10:45."
- When Jesus stood in tax collect Zacchaeus' home, he stated it another way: 'For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost.' Luke 19:10."

With Jesus as a leader as a servant for his mission, he led also with a vision of what were things to come. Jesus often described that vision of things to come as "The Kingdom of God/Heaven" Wilkes indicates the discovery of seven principles to Lead as Jesus led as a servant:

- 1. Jesus humbled himself and allowed God to exalt Him.
- 2. Jesus followed his Father's will rather that sought a position.
- 3. Jesus defined greatness as being a servant and being first as becoming a slave.
- 4. Jesus risked serving others because he trusted that he was God's Son.
- 5. Jesus left his place at the head table to serve the needs of others.
- 6. Jesus shared responsibility and authority with those he called to lead.
- 7. Jesus built a team to carry out a worldwide vision.

Wilkes uses these seven principles as the corner stone of the following chapters throughout the book. Going deeper into the seven factors and the supporting scriptures to give use a spiritual guide through the teachings of Christ in the Gospels so that we may lead as servant throughout our daily lives. Each of the principles stands alone as well as being a part of the entire servant-leadership model:

PRINICIPLE #1: Humble your Heart

"Servant leaders humble themselves and wait for God to exalt them" (based on Luke 14:7-11). This principle comes from Jesus' story about choosing places of honor at a banquet. Servant leaders humble themselves to the mission entrusted to them. They also wait expectantly for God to exalt them - in God's timing. Servant leaders trust that the Host will choose those he wants at the head table of leadership." p.25.

PRINCIPLE #2: First be a Follower

"Servant leaders follow Jesus rather than seek a position" (based on Mark 10:32-40). This tenet comes from James and John's request of Jesus that they sit on his right and left when He came into His glory. p.25

PRINCIPLE #3: Find greatness in Service

"Servant leaders give up personal rights to find greatness in service to others" (based on Mark10:45). The other ten disciples did not appreciate James and John's boldness with Jesus. When the Master saw that they had become indignant with their peers, He defined greatness begins with those who become servants to the mission of the group and those teamed with them to carry out that mission.

PRINCIPLE #4: Take risks

"Servant leaders can risk serving others because they trust that God is in control of their lives" (based on John 13:3). Only when you trust God with absolute control of your life can you risk losing yourself in service to others.

Trusting God includes believing that God is working with at least five "raw materials" to form you into a unique servant leader. Those raw materials are your spiritual gifts, experiences, relational style, vocational skills and enthusiasm. These elements make up your "S.E.R.V.E." profile. p 26.

PRINCIPLE #5: Take up the Towel

"Servant leaders take up Jesus' towel of servant hood to meet the needs of others" (based on John 13:4-11). Jesus stepped down from His place at the Passover meal to set an example for his disciples. He took up the towel and washbasin of a slave to model his mission and show his love for those he recruited to carry out that mission after his ascension. p. 26.

PRINCIPLE #6: Share Responsibilities and Authority

"Servant leaders share their responsibility and authority with others to meet a greater need" (based on Acts 6:1-6). Jesus equipped his disciples to carry out a worldwide vision. He shared both responsibility and authority with them to make disciples of all people. p.26

PRINCIPLE #7: Build a Team

"Servant leaders multiply their leadership by empowering others to lead" (based on Mark 6:7). Leadership of a team is the highest expression of servant leadership. This is true because team leadership embodies each of the principles of servant leadership. p. 27.

Wilkes states," If you will apply these seven principles of servant leadership as taught and modeled by Jesus, I am convinced you will become more effective as a leader, and those who have been entrusted to you will be more likely to place on you the mantle of leadership".

An excellent read in that it reminds the reader of the prime importance of leadership as an individual, spouse, parent, church member and child of God in the Body of Christ. I recommend this for all those that have chosen to become leaders in their lives! We take turns re-reading our copy making multiple notes throughout the edition. 

Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own?

For you were bought at a price, therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are Gods.

—1 Corinthians 6:19-20



Being in a sound mind and body can provide you with the best foundation for praise. The word tells us that our bodies are as temples and should be treated as so. Recently we discussed in Sunday school about keeping



Jesus is Crucified

Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the common hall, and gathered unto him the whole band of soldiers. And they stripped him, and put on him a scarlet robe. And when they had platted a crown of thorns, they put it upon his head, and a reed in his right hand; and they bowed the knee before him, and mocked him, saying Hail King of the Jews! And they spit on him, and took the reed, and smote him on the head. And after that they had mocked him, they took the robe off from him, and put his own raiment on him and led him away to crucify him. (Matthew 27:27-31) And as they led him away, they laid hold upon one Simon, a Cyrenian, coming out of the country, and on him they laid the cross, that he might bear it after Jesus. And there followed him a great company of people and women, which also bewailed and lamented him. (Luke 23:26-27). And when they were come to the place, which is called Calvary, there they crucified him, and the malefactors, one on the right hand, and the other on the left. Then said Jesus, Father forgive them; for they know not what they do. (Luke 23:33-34) Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took his garments, and made four parts, to every soldier a part; and also his coat: now the coat was without seam, woven from the top throughout. They said therefore among themselves, Let us not rend it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall be: that the Scripture might be fulfilled, which saith, They parted my raiment among them, and for my vesture they did cast lots. These things therefore the soldiers did. (John 19:23-24)

The Last Supper

And his disciples went forth, and came into the city, and found as he said unto them: and they made ready for the Passover. And in the evening he cometh with the twelve. (*Mark 14:16-17*) And as they did eat, Jesus took bread, and blessed, and brake it, and gave to them, and said, Take, eat; this is my body. And he took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them: and they all drank of it. And he said unto them, This is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many. Verily I say unto you. I will drink no more of the fruit of the vine, until that day that I drink it new in the kingdom of God. (*Mark 14:22-25*)

Jesus Dies and Is Buried

And it was about the sixth hour, and there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour. And the sun was darkened, and the vail of the temple was rent in the midst. And when Jesus had cried out with a loud voice, he said, Father into thy hands I commend my spirit: and having said thus, he gave up the ghost. Now when the centurion saw what was done, he glorified God, saying, Certainly this was a righteous man. (Luke 23:44-47) When the even was come, there came a rich man of Arimathea, named Joseph, who also himself was Jesus' disciple: He went to Pilate, and begged the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be delivered. And when Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn out in the rock: and he rolled a great stone to the door of the sepulchre, and departed. (Matthew 27:57-60) And Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses beheld where he was laid. (Mark 15:47)

Jesus is Risen!

And very early in the morning, the first day of the week, they came unto the sepulcher at the rising of the sun. And they said among themselves, Who shall roll us away the stone from the door of the sepulcher? And when they looked, they saw that the stone was rolled away: for it was very great. And entering into the sepulcher, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a long white garment; and they were affrighted. And he saith unto them, Be not affrighted: ye seek Jesus of Nazareth, which was crucified: he is risen; he is not

here: behold the place where they laid him. But go your way, tell his disciples and Peter that he goeth before you into Galilee: there shall ye see him, as he said unto you. (*Mark 16:2-7*) So then, after the Lord had spoken unto them, he was received up into

heaven and sat on the right hand of God. And they went forth, and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following. Amen. (*Mark 16:19-20*)



Topic: As a Christian If You could teach the Everyone in the World three things what would they be. (Please reference Scripture)



Greeting Saints:

It is my pleasure to spend time with everyone this Resurrection Season. No other time during the year; I believe, should we have the greatest hope and admiration of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It takes a special kind of mind set to understand the Resurrection. Do you believe Jesus is the Son of God. Do you believe that on the third day He rose from the chains of death, having ALL Power and Glory?
