"Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "God is with us." (Matt 1:23) When God is with us, he speaks to us though His word, "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without me you can do nothing... If you abide in Me and my words abide in you, the you can ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you... These things are spoken to you, that My Joy may remain in you, and that your JOY may be full. "(John 15:5, 7,11).



Christmas, I think has a special meaning to me this year. I have heard the name of Jesus long before I knew how to spell, J-E-S-U-S. This year for me was a test of patience and endurance. This year has been a test of patience and endurance for a lot of people I know. There have been changes, additions, and subtractions of all kinds throughout this year. One thing remains the same, which is the story of Jesus' birth. I am truly glad about that. The story about a child born in a lowly manager to a virgin named Mary. The story is indeed about the promised Messiah, hope for our future. Only Matthew and Luke tell about Jesus' birth. However, Luke preserves the now-famous Christmastime reading but both versions describe Jesus as the world's Savior sent from God. The story is beautifully told by two points of view, one of Joseph in book of Matthew and the other from Mary in the book of Luke. Matthew recalls it from Joseph's dreams advising him to go ahead with the marriage and later to take his family to Egypt to escape the Bethlehem slaughter. "18, Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly. ²⁰ But while he thought about these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit." Matthew 1:18-20. NKJV edition. The book of Luke from Mary's reporting her visit from the angel Gabriel. "26Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a city of Galilee name Nazareth. ²⁷ to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ And having come in, the angel said to her, Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women,!" Luke 1:26-28. NKJV edition. This is a wonderful season of love, hope and peace. So while you are visiting with your family and friends this Christmas season remember why this season exist; to bring us hope, and have a future with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ from Bethlehem.
